President's Message

I would first like to thank all our members that have supported my appointment to President for the 2005-2006 year. I look forward to working together with our Board of Governors, our volunteers and our entire membership to strengthen our Chapter and continue the long-standing excellence which the Chapter has been noted for.

Our ASHRAE theme for the year is taken from a Chinese proverb:

When you drink the water, remember the spring.

Everyone in our industry and the general public drinks the water afforded by the technologies that ASHRAE establishes through Standards, Guidelines and best practices. Yet most do not appreciate the source of these acceptable practices. It comes from you, the ASHRAE members who volunteer their time to ensure the highest levels of our industry standards are developed and met.

CHAPTER GOALS

Our Philadelphia Chapter has over 900 area-assigned members and is one of the largest chapters in the Society. While on the surface this is something to hang our hats on, there are a number of issues that we as a Chapter need to address.

COMMUNICATIONS-Over the past several years, we have gone to an electronic format versus a monthly mailer to conserve cost. Approximately 60% of our members are currently receiving monthly electronic communications. We would like to raise this to 100% so that all members receive the monthly Chapter news. Please contact Hope Silverman at our Chapter office with your email address.

VOLUNTEERS- Currently our Board is comprised of 11 members. In addition, we have approximately 14 members who have expressed interest in devoting time to the Chapter for a total of 25. This comprises less than 3% of our membership. Our goal for this year is to double this number and continue to raise volunteer participation in the chapter to at least 15% as a sustainable figure in the future. MONTHLY MEETINGS- The Program Committee has established a full schedule for this upcoming year.

Average attendance in the past few years has been in the range of 64 people (only after last minute reservations and/ or walk ins), about 7% of our membership. The Chapter subsidizes these meetings and due to lack of attendance is forced to dip into our ever-dwindling reserve fund. We ask that the membership take time out of their busy schedules to attend the monthly meetings and pre-register before the last minute. The goal is to raise attendance to about 15% of membership at each meeting. Contact Programs Committee Chair/President–Elect Stephen Piccolo regarding suggestions to meet this goal.

CONTRIBUTIONS- While we each pay Society and Chapter dues, they are supplemented both by corporate and individual contributions on the local level. Please consider contributing when asked.

After-Dinner Presentation

"Past and Ongoing ASHRAE Research Projects"

This talk will describe and summarize research findings and results of five ASHRAE-funded research projects performed by the speaker in the last 6 years. Other than the first two which are ongoing (and due for completion in January 2006), the other three projects have been completed and related technical papers also published. These involve:

- (1) RP-1275: Evaluation and Assessment of Fault Detection and Diagnostic Methods for Centrifugal Chillers- Phase II; sponsored by TC 7.5: Smart Building Systems;
- (2) RP1051: Procedures for Reconciling Computer-Calculated Results with Measured Energy Data; sponsored by TC 4.7: Energy Estimation Methods;
- (3) RP-1146: Building Operation and Dynamics within an Aggregated Load; sponsored by TC 7.4: Building Dynamics;
- (4) RP-1139: Development and Comparison of On-Line Model Training Techniques for Model-Based FDD Methods Applied to Vapor Compression Equipment; sponsored by TC 7.5: Smart Building Systems: and
- (5) RP-1004: Methodology Development to
 Determine the Long-Term
 Performance of Cool Storage Systems
 from Short-Term Measurements;
 sponsored by TC 7.6: Systems
 Utilization.

Another research project (RP 1312) with another Drexel faculty, Dr. Jin Wen, as PI, which started a few weeks back on modeling and validating air-handler models for fault detection and diagnosis purposes will also be described.

Speaker Bio

T. Agami Reddy, Ph.D., P.E. is a Professor in the Civil, Architectural and Environmental Engineering Department at Drexel University, with a joint appointment with the Mechanical Engineering and Mechanics Department. He was a Visiting Faculty at the Mechanical Engineering Department, and Associate Director of the Energy Systems Laboratory of Texas A&M University (1991-97), a Research Staff member and Lecturer at the Mechanical and Aerospace Department of Princeton University (1988-91), and an Assistant Professor at the Energy Technology Division of Asian Institute of Technology (85-86). He joined Drexel University in September 1997. His current research interests are in the areas of heating, ventilating, air-conditioning and refrigeration; energy efficiency; and in solar and renewable energy. He has been involved in 25 funded research projects (federal, state and privately funded), 14 of which he was PI or Co-PI. Dr. Reddy is active in ASHRAE: he is member of several technical committees (TC 4.7 and 7.5), and was involved in several research project monitoring committees. As part of TC 4.7, he made an extensive revision of Chapter 31 of the Fundamentals Handbook dealing with inverse energy analysis methods. He has over 120 research papers in the following topics: modeling, simulation and design, inverse modeling of energy use, fault detection and diagnosis. parameter estimation techniques, and risk analysis. He has taught courses in the areas of heat transfer, thermodynamics, modeling and simulation of solar and energy systems, refrigeration and air-conditioning, building systems, energy conservation, inverse modeling, modeling, simulation and design of HVAC&R systems.

MEMBERSHIP ADVANCEMENT!

Any Associate Member meeting the following requirement can apply for Advancement to the more entitling Member grade. By ASHRAE society definition:

A *member* shall have the equivalent of *twelve society-approved years of experience* composed of an approved combination of: (a) completed education beyond high school, (b) work experience, and (c) professional engineering or related registration or license issued by a legally authorized body.

All technical and scientific education shall be based on curricula approved by the Board of Directors.

Approved engineering curricula shall be equivalent to the accredited by the Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology in the United States of America or the Canadian Engineering Accreditation Board. Scientific education in fields other than engineering shall be from a college or university course of study that has been accredited by an organization charged with monitoring standards of performance. Society approved years of experience shall be credited as follows:

One and one-half years of credit for each year of completed education for graduates of approved technical curricula. One year of credit for each year of education for non-graduates who have completed a least two years of approved technical curricula. One year of credit for each year of completed education for graduates of colleges or universities which do not have accreditations. Those holding associated degrees from technical institutions shall also be credited for one year for each year of education.

One year for each year of qualifying work experiences in the performance of duties in work related to ASHRAE fields of interest and shall have included research, teaching, design, contracting, engineering sales or engineering management.

Three years of credit for professional registration of license issued by a legally authorized body in engineering or related fields, the requirements of which as to education, examination, and active practice are satisfactory to the Board of Directors.

October's program will feature SMACNA's new HVAC Duct Construction Standards, which was recently revised for the first time in ten years after extensive computer simulation and duct specimen testing. Some of the key changes include detailed tables for T-25a and T-25b joints; expansion of mid-panel tie-rods; double-wall duct construction details; and expansion of the pressure class selection tables. Also included in the new Standards are an engineering and design chapter and additions to the round and oval duct tables.
